

## Our Health Plan & Guidelines

The best time to spay or neuter is before maturation. Yet the decision to do so is one you should consider wisely. Please review our recommendation and benefits concerning the decision to spay or neuter your pet within our Spay or Neuter Brochure either located on our website or within our office.



### PUPPY VACCINATIONS

We recommend that puppies receive vaccinations at 8, 12, and 16 weeks of age. The veterinarian will examine your puppy at each visit.

16 weeks	3rd		1st

Sometimes breeders have an extra DHPP set done at 6 weeks. This set should be repeated at 8, 12 and 16 weeks.

### Kitten VACCINATIONS

We recommend that kittens receive vaccinations at 8 and 12 weeks of age. The veterinarian will examine your kitten at each visit.

Age	FDRC	Leukemia	Rabies
8 weeks	1st	1st	
12 weeks	2nd	2nd	1st

Sometimes breeders have an extra FDRC set done at 6 weeks. This set should be repeated at 8, and 12 weeks.

### FDRC Combination

**Feline Distemper** Highly contagious. Fever, appetite loss, vomiting, diarrhea, dehydration, and death.

**Rhinotracheitis** Respiratory disease affects upper air passages and lungs

**Calicivirus** Severe fever, inactivity, vomiting and diarrhea that is often bloody. High mortality rate.



### DHPP Combination

**Distemper** Severe fever, sneezing, anorexia, vomiting. Secondary bacterial infections are common and may be fatal.

**Hepatitis** Virus causing inflammation of the liver, severe kidney damage and death.

**Parvo** Severe weakness, vomiting, diarrhea that is often bloody. High mortality rate, particularly in puppies.

**Parainfluenza** Respiratory Disease causing coughing and discomfort throughout the body.
